### Special Educational Needs—Dyslexia

Sometimes parents speak to us with regards to concerns that their child has dyslexia. If you have these concerns please speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance. If you have these concerns or your child has a diagnosis, you can help at home by:

1. Post routine charts
2. Use visual timers
3. Give clear, concise directions
4. Employ multi-sensory learning
5. Teach emotional regulation
6. Develop phonological awareness
7. Play games for phonemic awareness
8. Foster their interest and strengths
9. Read aloud to your child
