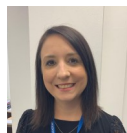


Message from Miss Snow

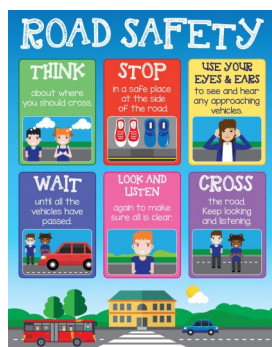


Safe
